#### **Headcount ratio of catastrophic health expenditure**

A household is identified as facing catastrophic health expenditures when its out-of-pocket health expenditures represent 40% or more of its capacity-to-pay Capacity-to-pay is estimated as total expenditure net of a subsistence level of food expenditure
